On the airport, AirTrain is free to connect to terminals, car rentals and parking lots.

Purchase a ticket to ride on AirTrain from NJ TRANSIT or Amtrak ticket agents and vending machines - one ticket does it all. If you're taking PATH, you will pay \$1.75 for the ride on PATH and pay the remaining portion when you purchase the NJ TRANSIT ticket.

Be sure to check the NJ Transit or Amtrak train schedule, especially first and last train times weekdays, weekends and holidays.


